Breed Origin

DNA sequencing study of 10 Chows, 4 Grey Wolves and 8 Chinese indigenous dogs – China 2017:

31,700 years ago – dogs separate from gray wolves

8,300 years ago – Chows originate from, and are closest to, Chinese indigenous dogs, from the South of China

Genetic Development

- * Phenotype: blue tongue 1 gene PDPK1 mutation, and Chromosome 24, ASIP gene. Affect pigment.
- * Strong evidence of positive selection for:
 - metabolism and digestion
 - muscle and cardiac development
 - * 44 teeth

Inner Mongolia Monastery Visit 1937 - 1945

Dr. Abshagen:

- * Chow rare breed, not a street cur to be eaten
- * Bred according to centuries old traditions, records
- * Breeding exchanges Tibetan monasteries, thousands of km

- * 50 blue Chows "bluer than the finest blue Persian cat", the color of a wild dove. Distinctive bark.

- * Black noses (not blue) & Black mouth pigment
- * Red fleck = mongrel
- Strong straight bone
- Small strong round feet
- * Thick, harsh coat
- Small triangular ears
- * 20-25 kg and 45-50 cm

Dr. Abshagen:

- * Guard
- Protect the monastery and monks
- * Round up "hundreds of head of cattle"
- * Hunt game to bear
- * Sturdy and healthy, no entropian



Classification: CKC SPITZ BREED

FCI: ASIAN SPITZ AKC: ARCTIC TYPE

CKC: some characteristics associated

with Molossoid breeds: (FCI)

Heavy bone

Broad skull

Thick neck - not a "flat" face breed

CKC: generally NOT BRACHYCEPHALIC

AKC includes Chows on their list of brachycephalic breeds





JUDGE EXAMINATION

- * CKC & AKC: examine on the ramp (if re-examine MUST ramp)
- * Always approach from the front poor peripheral vision
- * Allow Chow to scent your presence before contact
- * Handler shows bite, tongue pigment & mouth tissue
- * Maintain continuous physical contact until exam is finished
- Check topline, muscle / body condition & harsh coat texture
- * Manage your ring: note impact of flooring, heat and wind

* NEVER: APPROACH FROM THE SIDE, REAR OR GRAB TESTICLES

SIZE

- * CKC: Average M = 18'' 21'' (46 53 cm)
- * CKC: Average F = 17'' 20'' (43 51 cm)
- * CKC: IN EVERY CASE, overall balance and type takes precedence over size
- * AKC: Adults: 17" 20" (43 51 cm) in every case, overall proportion and type take precedence over size
- * FCI: M = 185/7'' 223/64'' (48 56 cm)
- * FCI: F = 18" 20" (46 51 cm)
- * Australia: minimum 18" (46 cm) no gender difference

- * CKC: 5 acceptable colours
- * CKC: colour must be clear ALL ARE EQUAL IN MERIT
- CKC: Solid throughout, lighter shadings permitted
- * AKC: 5 colours: red, black, blue, cinnamon, cream
- * AKC: acknowledges lighter shading
- * FCI: 6 colours: red, black, blue, fawn, cream or white
- * UK: 6 colours: red, black, blue, fawn, cream or white
- UK: whole colour, frequently shaded


COAT COLOUR

- New CKC Standard may include a Disqualification
- * CKC RULE 14.3 AND 14.4 = cannot compete must leave the ring

ANY OTHER COLOUR e.g. chocolate with brown nose/eye pigment ANY OTHER COLOUR e.g. lilac (a dilute of chocolate)

COAT PATTERN: BRINDLE, MERLE, TRI-COLOUR OR PARTI-COLOURED

Chocolate



A published research paper confirmed the dog is purebred, and the chocolate colour is a genetic mutation in the Chow.

The breeder of this dog states that In the UK, chocolate Chows are bred, but not shown.

Lilac (a dilute of chocolate)





Same dog – nose colour is not slate, as occurs in a cinnamon (fawn)

Chocolate and Lilac dilute acceptable colours??

Pros

Naturally occurring colour in purebred Broaden the gene pool

Cons


Commercial exploitation \$\$\$ Encourage color patterns not historically part of the breed: merle, tri-colour, brindle, parti-colour

Trimming

- Only feet
- * OTHER THAN TRIMMING THE FEET NO OBVIOUS TRIMMING, SCULPTING, TIPPING OF GUARD HAIRS OR SHAPING OF THE COAT IS PERMITTED
- * Penalize: degree deviates from natural appearance
- * Hocks ok to tidy and shape
- WANT guard hair tips
- NO clipping of the coat


HEAD

- Large, proudly carried
- * Skull: broad, flat, well filled
- * Stop: moderate
- * Muzzle: short, broad, 1/3rd of head length
- * Muzzle: depth = breadth
- * Nose: large, broad
- * Teeth: strong, scissor bite





CKC: Limited peripheral vision – **always** approach from front AKC


AKC: Serious faults: Entropian, Ectropian, Pupils wholly or partially obscured by loose skin - watch for tears, squinting, watery eyes

AKC: Scowl – padded button of skin above inner corner of each eye, distinct furrow between the eyes

FCI: oval – clean

Australia: almond shaped

* CKC: Small, thick, slightly rounded at the tip, stiffly carried with a slight forward tilt, the inner corner of the ear to be in line with the outer corner of the eye.

EARS

- * AKC: Small moderately thick, triangular in shape with a slight rounding at the tip, carried stiffly erect, but with a slight forward tilt. Placed wide apart with the inner corner on top of the skull.
- * FCI: Small, thick, slightly rounded at the tip, carried stiffly and wide apart but tilting well forward over eyes and slightly towards each other, giving peculiar characteristic scowling expression.

EARS – KEY WORDS

Small, thick, slightly rounded tip, stiff, wide apart

- * CKC & AKC DQ: DROP EAR OR EARS:
 - * STIFFLY CARRIED OR STIFFLY ERECT BUT WHICH BREAKS OVER AT ANY POINT FROM ITS BASE TO ITS TIP OR ...

CKC & AKC DQ: DROP EAR OR EARS

FCI: A fault – not a DQ

NOSE COLOUR – DQ's!!

- * CKC Red or Black coat = BLACK nose
- CKC DQ Red or Black spotted with pink, streaked with pink or distinctly any other colour than solid black
- * **CKC** Blue or Cinnamon coat solid blue/grey or slate nose, darker
- * CKC DQ: Blue or Cinnamon spotted, streaked, not solid blue/grey
- * **CKC** Cream coat lighter colour rim pigment brown/liver nose
- * CKC NO DQ for cream natural nose colour not artificial colour

AKC - FCI Nose Pigment

- * AKC: same as CKC for red and black coats black nose
- * AKC: Cream ranging from dark black/brown to pinkish, with or without darker nose rim at outer edges as puppies/adults
- * AKC DQ: spotted or distinctly other colour than black EXCEPT in blue may be solid blue or slate
- * FCI: Black, lighter (cream or near white) or self-Coloured (dilute). Black preferred in all cases
- * FCI: large & wide for good breathing no DQ for Colour
- * Australia: black, large & wide (except cream and white then light colour acceptable), Blue and Fawn self colored, black preferred for all colours. Fault: off black nose except cream, white, blue, fawn


CKC: Lighter colour with or without darker rim pigment NATURAL COLOUR

FCI: "... black (... exception cream and near white, in which case a lighter coloured nose is permissible... (but black preferable in all cases)."

AKC: "black in colour ... except in blue Chows. Cream from dark black/brown to pinkish with or without darker nose rim. OK in adults and puppies.




